Morning Summer Programs for Children Ages 3-8

MORNING PROGRAMS: 9:00 - noon \$125 per week

Activities in our weekly sessions are arranged around a central theme. Throughout the morning, children will engage in indoor and outdoor hands-on experiences related to the theme, including art, crafts, science, physical recreation and more.

Enrollment is for one or more five-day (full) weeks only. One-half of tuition is due at registration.

Week 1: Summer of Service (June 29-July 3)

Start the summer off on a positive note, learning how you can make a difference in your home, community, and on our planet. We will complete one community project during our week together. Discover how one child can make a difference!

Week 2: Travel Through the Decades (July 6-July 10)

Ever want to wear a poodle skirt or leather jacket, dress up like a hippie or attend a disco dance party. Travel through the fifties, sixties, and seventies learning about music, clothing, and popular games of the "ancient" world!

Week 3: Transportation and Travel (July 13-July 17)

From the horse and buggy to electric cars; transportation and travel have undergone some major changes in the past century! Wonder what the future has in store? Come and be part of history in the making with your own travel inventions!

Week 4: Ooey Gooey Science (July 20-24)

Roll up your sleeves and get ready for some messy, hands-on science experiments! Find out how to make a lava lamp, silly putty, and flubber! We may even experiment with colors, wind, water, energy, and matter. Every day a new scientific mystery will be unraveled!

Week 5: Pirates of Saratoga Lake (July 27-31)

Discover what life on a ship was really like on the open seas! Participate in a treasure hunt and learn about some of the most famous pirates of the seventeenth and eighteenth century.

Week 6: Medieval Times (August 3-August 7)

Sure, castles and dragons are cool, but what was life really like for the Knights of the Round Table? Together we will explore what daily life inside a castle was like for everyone from the children, to the peasants, and of course, the royalty.

Week 7: Let's Play! (August 10-August 14)

A week dedicated to the most amazing game shows around! Play Wheel of Fortune, Let's Make a Deal, and Jeopardy! You may even design and create your own game to play at the end of the week! It is sure to be a great time!

Afternoon Summer Programs for Children Ages 8 and up

Older kids can explore technology, engineering, science or art in these week long programs. Register for as many weeks as you'd like. One-half tuition is due at registration.

Week 1: Roaring into Robots, by Bits, Bytes, & Bots-Computer Adventures (June 29-July 3)
Ages 8-14 **1:00-4:30**

This exciting class teaches you how to build and program the new LEGO® Mindstorms® NXT robots, the coolest robot available. You will use your new skills to meet such challenges as reacting to intruders, moving objects to different locations, stinging an intruder with a robot tail, or beating your opponent at LEGO® Sumo.

Week 2: Make A Movie, by Bits, Bytes, & Bots-Computer Adventures (July 6-July 10)
Ages 8-14 **1:00-4:30**

Learn to make a stop-motion animated film that uses LEGO® and other characters to tell a story. If you've ever wanted to direct your own movies or like making up stories, then this camp is for you. Using digital cameras, animation software, and video editing software, you'll create multi-scene movies with transitions, titles, credits, sound effects and narration. Design your own set with backgrounds, characters, and scenery. The stories are up to your imagination. **Cost: \$235**

Week 3: Technology Creations With Electricity (July 13-July 17)
Ages 8-11 **1:00-4:00**

Technology is anything that is created to solve problems or make life better, and it can also be a lot of fun. In this class we will explore projects in electricity, problem solving and even take a look at how our computers and the internet works. We will explore basic electricity concepts and use this knowledge to design our own game and electric spinner and buzzer. We will explore the inner workings of a computer by taking it apart and learning how it works. Technology is all around us! **Cost: \$125**

Week 4: Technology Creations With Machines (July 20-July 24)
Ages 8-11 **1:00-4:00**

Technology is anything that is created to solve problems or make life better, and it can also be a lot of fun. In this class we will build simple and compound machines. Each student will design and race his his or her own mousetrap car. We will explore gears and mechanisms with Fishertechnik parts. As a class we will design and build a Rube Goldberg machine. **Cost: \$125**

Week 5: Science Explorers: Dream It, Design It, Build It (July 27-July 31)
Ages 8-11 **1:00-4:00**

Take this class and you'll be dreaming, designing, and building bridges, towers, geodomes, boats, and catapults, just to name a few. You'll have a "blast" testing out your designs. **Cost: \$125**

Week 6: A "Trip" to the Artist Hall of Fame (August 3- August 7)
Ages 8-11 **1:00-4:00**

Ever wonder how Michelangelo painted the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel? Or how Alexander Calder made his magnificent mobiles? This week is for you! Each day we will discover and explore an artist's life, time and work. Then we'll create our own artistic interpretations of each artistic genre and include some creative writing too! **Cost: \$125**

Week 7: Art Around the World (August 10-August 14)
Ages 8-11 **1:00-4:00**

As we "travel" the globe we will discover some of the many wonderful expressions of art that can be found in various cultures. Each day we will explore a different culture and create our own interpretations of what we have learned about. As we begin each project, we will be inspired through examples of art and music of the region. We will start with Australian Aboriginal art and "travel" from there. **Cost: \$125**
